Because of this, the regular lay forum and meeting of People Empowerment for Arthritis and Lupus (PEARL) was stopped for the safety of the doctors and patients. Thankfully, with decreasing number of daily cases and easing up of community restrictions, a hybrid PEARL forum was planned. The objective of the activity was to see how the patients were doing amidst the pandemic and to celebrate the World Lupus Day which is usually celebrated every May 10. In addition, this allows rheumatology fellows to be up close and personal with patient partners – something we, fellows, have not yet experienced since the start of our training.

The event was held last May 8, 2022 at PengLai Chinese Restaurant at West Avenue, Quezon City.
