Thomasians on the Go at APLAR 2025



Thomasians made their mark at APLAR 2025, taking part in sessions that spotlighted groundbreaking research and practical advances in rheumatology. Dr. Sandra Navarra led the session on Updates and Case Studies in SLE, with Dr. Sephora Matilos and Dr. Norwin Philip Bation presenting two complex cases. In the following days, Dr. Julie Li-Yu spearheaded a key discussion on osteoporosis, while Dr. Christine Bernal delivered a presentation on Redefining Treatment: Multitarget Approaches for Difficult-to-Treat Pediatric Lupus Nephritis.





Beyond their oral case presentations, **Thomasian rheumatologists and fellows-in-training showcased valuable contributions through the poster sessions**, where they presented noteworthy clinical cases and significant research findings. Their work reflected the strong commitment of the Philippine delegation to shaping rheumatology through research, innovation, and collaboration at APLAR 2025.





Thomasian at the Forefront of SLE Discussions



In its concluding sessions, the congress featured a scientific discussion on "SLE: Comorbidities and Less Common Manifestations" which highlighted difficult but often overlooked aspects of lupus. Chaired by Dr. Chi Chiu Mok (Hong Kong) and Dr. Kenji Oku (Japan), the session featured experts tackling bone health, neuropsychiatric disease, and antiphospholipid syndrome (APS) in SLF.

Dr. Sandra Navarra (University of Santo Tomas, Philippines) opened with a lecture on osteoporosis and avascular necrosis, stressina prevention and vigilant monitoring in patients long-term on glucocorticoids. Dr. Alberta Hoi (Australia) followed with updates on neuropsychiatric lupus, underscoring complexity and the value its multidisciplinary care. The session closed with Dr. Kenji Oku (Japan) on thrombotic obstetric and APS, anticoagulation presenting current pregnancy management and strategies.



The discussions reinforced the importance of early recognition, comprehensive care, and international collaboration. **Dr. Navarra's participation once again placed Thomasians at the forefront of advancing lupus care in the Asia-Pacific.**



Passing the Torch: Closing Ceremony of APLAR 2025
